# **Proxy Voting .....**

..... is available for anyone who cannot attend the General Membership meeting. Please contact a trustee for a proxy form. You may also download a proxy form from our website. You may give your proxy vote to any other RLI member or RLI board member to vote on your behalf on the matters of trustee elections, budget approval and bylaw changes. You may give direction on your voting, or you may entrust your nominated member to vote for you as they consider appropriate. Your completed proxy form must be at the RLI PO box 48 hours prior to the meeting, or recorded at the meeting prior to the Call to Order.

# **Boat Ramp Use**

As winter approaches and you want to get your toys off the water please note the following procedures:

- 1. There are no set open hours for the boat ramp. Please call your area trustees to make an appointment. If one of your area trustees is not available then try other area trustees. <u>Please provide at least 24 hours advance notice</u> so we can schedule boats together when possible. Thank you.
- 2. We will be enforcing our Bylaws during 2013 to better address safety and lake access concerns. In order to use the boat ramp:
  - Your RLI annual dues must be paid for all owned properties;
  - Watercraft must be titled to Runyan Lake riparian property owners or their renters (State and local law);
  - Your state of Michigan watercraft registration must be current (State law);
  - A 2013 RLI boat sticker must be present on the boat.
- 3. Watercraft and trailers must be clean if coming from another water body to minimize risk of introducing invasive species. Please require any marina or trailer service you utilize to do the same. Starry Stonewort is now here because it was introduced from another lake at the RLI boat ramp! Please protect your lake!

# **Fair Warning**

The DNR and Livingston County Sheriff have keys to the boat ramp and may visit the lake at any time. State laws and your Runyan Lake Inc. bylaws require compliance with state of Michigan boating regulations, including having your boat registered with the state. We encourage you to be sure your boat registration is current.

# **Water Quality**

Testing for E. coli bacteria was performed on July 30th. Bacteria counts were less than the state of Michigan public health standard for total body contact recreation, such as swimming. Our lake water is safe. Detailed test information and locations can be found on our website.

# Weed Control

Weed control treatment was provided by Aquatic Nuisance Plant Control again this year. Treatments were applied on June 4<sup>th</sup>, July 16<sup>th</sup>, and August 7<sup>th</sup>. More details are available on our website. Please contact a trustee if you have any concerns.

# **Goose Control**

Despite periodic appearances, at the time of the planned removal no geese were present on the lake!

# Michigan Boating Laws.....

# 100 Foot Rule

Please remember to observe the 100 foot rule - if your watercraft is moving fast enough to create a wake you must stay at least 100 feet from the shore or any boat, dock, or raft.

# Spotters and PFD's Required

State law requires you have a spotter in the boat when tubing, skiing, wakeboarding, or wake surfing. Personal Floatation Devices (life vests) are also required.

# More Michigan Boating Laws.....

# Age Restrictions

Persons less than 12 years of age:

- May operate a boat powered by a motor of no more than 6 horsepower (hp) legally without restrictions.
- May operate a boat powered by a motor of more than 6 hp but no more than 35 hp legally only if they are directly supervised on board by a person at least 16 years of age.
- May not operate a boat powered by a motor of more than 35 hp legally under any conditions.

Persons 12 to 15 years of age:

- May operate a boat powered by a motor of no more than 6 hp legally without restrictions.
- May operate a boat powered by a motor of more than 6 hp legally only if they:
  - Have passed a boating safety course approved by the Department of Natural Resources and have on board their boating safety certificate or...
  - Are accompanied on board by a person at least 16 years of age.

Persons 16 years of age or older may operate any boat on the waters of Michigan. See stipulations for Personal Watercraft (PWC) below.

# Personal Watercraft

- Those less than 14 years of age may not legally operate a PWC.
- Those 14 and 15 years of age may operate a PWC legally only if they have obtained a boating safety certificate and...
- He or she is accompanied on board by his or her parent or legal guardian or by a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal quardian or...
- He or she is operating or riding the PWC at a distance of not more than 100 feet from his or her parent or legal guardian or from a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal guardian.

Those at least 16 years of age and born after December 31, 1978 may operate a PWC legally only if they have obtained a boating safety certificate.

Those born on or before December 31, 1978, may operate a PWC legally without restrictions.
