#### **Goose Control**

The program was suspended by the State of Michigan this year due to COVID-19 concerns.

#### **Weed Control**

Aquatic weed control treatments were provided by Aqua-Weed Inc. this year. Treatments were applied on June  $3^{rd}$  &  $12^{th}$ , and July  $10^{th}$  &  $31^{st}$ . More details are available on our website.

#### Water Quality

Testing for E. coli bacteria was performed on 6/22 and 8/11. Bacteria counts were well below the state of Michigan public health standard for total body contact recreation, such as swimming. Detailed test information and test locations can be found on our website.

#### **Purple Loosestrife Alert**

Purple Loosestrife is in season! If you see and can access the invasive plant Purple Loosestrife (spikes of purple flowers), please cut off the blooms and bag them carefully in a plastic garbage bag. Tie up the bag and place it in your trash. One plant has millions of seeds that will fall if not removed. This invasive plant will choke out native plants. #### Michigan Boating Laws

#### **Age Restrictions**

Persons less than 12 years of age:

 May not operate a boat powered by a motor of more than 35 hp legally under any conditions.

#### Persons 12 to 15 years of age:

- May operate a boat powered by a motor of more than 6 hp legally only if they:
  - Have passed a boating safety course approved by the Department of Natural Resources and have on board their boating safety certificate or...
  - o Are accompanied on board by a person at least 16 years of age.

Persons 16 years of age or older may operate any boat on the waters of Michigan. See stipulations for Personal Watercraft (PWC) below.

#### **Personal Watercraft**

- Those less than 14 years of age may not legally operate a PWC.
- Those 14 and 15 years of age may operate a PWC legally only if they have obtained a boating safety certificate and...
- He or she is accompanied on board by his or her parent or legal guardian or by a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal guardian or...
- He or she is operating or riding the PWC at a distance of not more than 100 feet from his or her parent or legal guardian or from a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal guardian.

Those at least 16 years of age and born after December 31, 1978, may operate a PWC legally only if they have obtained a boating safety certificate. Those born on or before December 31, 1978, may operate a PWC legally without restrictions.

It is illegal to operate a PWC during the period that begins at sunset and ends at 8:00 a.m. "Sunset" means that time determined by the national weather service.

#### **Pontoon Bow Riding**

Riding on the front (bow) of a pontoon while under way is extremely dangerous and illegal. If someone falls overboard the odds are they will be severely injured or killed. Please consider the safety of your family and friends by not allowing this behavior on your pontoon.

#### 100 Foot Rule

Please remember to observe the 100 foot rule – if your watercraft is moving fast enough to create a wake you must stay at least 100 feet from the shore or any boat, dock, or raft.

#### **Fair Warning**

The DNR and Livingston County Sheriff have keys to the boat ramp and may visit the lake at any time as permitted by State Law. Runyan Lake Inc. bylaws require compliance with State of Michigan boating regulations, including having your boat registered with the State. We encourage you to be sure your boat registration is current.

#### **Boat Ramp Use**

Note: Due to continued COVID-19 concerns and restrictions personal contact will be kept to a minimum. Please contact a trustee to arrange use of the boat ramp.

#### The following procedures remain in effect:

- 1. There are no set open hours for the boat ramp. Please call one of the area trustees to make an appointment. Leave a message if there is no answer. Please provide at least 24 hours advance notice so we can schedule boats together when possible. Thank you.
- 2. In order to use the RLI boat ramp, our boat ramp use policy, consistent with our Bylaws is:
  - Your RLI annual dues must be paid for all lots owned;
  - Watercraft must be titled to Runyan Lake riparian property owners or their renters; (State and local law)
  - Your state of Michigan watercraft registration must be current and displayed on the watercraft; (State law)
  - A 2020 RLI boat sticker must be present on the watercraft;
  - An RLI liability waiver should be on file.
- 3. Watercraft and trailers must be clean if coming from another water body to minimize risk of introducing invasive species. Please require any marina or trailer service you utilize to do the same. This is State law effective 2019! Please protect your lake!
